#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Bible Reading: A Journey Worth Taking

When I was a little boy, every Saturday night my grandmother would sit me down at the kitchen table and read to me the various stories of the Bible. With my feet barely touching the ground, I would sit there, mesmerized. I don't know exactly when, but overtime I grew to have a deep appreciation, for the stories of the Bible. If you were to ask me what my favorite Bible stories were, I would not be able to answer that question. I have too many favorites to name. I love the stories of Adam & Eve, Cain & Abel, the Tower of Babel, the Life of Moses, the Life of King David, the Book of Ruth; as well, the Birth Narratives of Jesus, the Parables of Jesus, and the Passion Narratives. Lately, I have been focusing on the women of the Bible. Women like Miriam (Moses' Sister), Hagar (Abraham's Mistress), Rahab, Queen Esther, Mary Magdalene, and Lydia (A Successful Businesswoman). Sometimes, these powerful women can seem like Hidden Figures in the background; but their stories are extremely powerful and should not be ignored. What are some of your favorite Bible stories/characters? And why? In addition to sensing a call from God, it was my love for the Bible that led me to divinity school.

Moreover, some of you have expressed a deep interest in learning more about the Bible. So, I want to share with you two resources that may help you on your journey:

- Understanding Your Bible in 15 Minutes a Day by, Daryl Aaron
- ➤ Life Application Study Bible Publisher: Tyndale House

When I first began trying to get a better grasp on the Bible, the two resources above served as crucial aides to my journey. If you choose to purchase them, I believe they will prove to be an asset, as you begin your journey of reading the Bible.

Finally, many people wonder: "So, where do I begin? The Bible is such a large *library*..." My suggestion is simple, begin where the *library* begins. Begin with Genesis and read it like a book.

After reading Genesis, read Exodus. After reading Exodus, read Leviticus. And after reading Leviticus, read Deuteronomy. These first five books (known as *The Pentateuch*) are foundational to understanding the rest of the books. Keep these little nuggets in mind while reading:



- Not everything in the Bible is to be taken literally; but should be taken, seriously. The ancient peoples had a unique way of writing to communicate their history and to communicate their interpretation of past events.
- ➤ The Bible is like a vast library full of various genres, such as historical narratives, fables, tales, laws/legal documents, genealogies, riddles, parables, prayers, songs, poems, biographies, and so much more. The Bible is also full of hyperbole, symbolism, numbers (with hidden meanings), metaphors, similes, idioms, etc.
- On Reading Genesis 1-11: Try not to read it with modern eyes; but attempt to view it from an Ancient Near Eastern Perspective. Keep in mind that there are doublets (e.g., two creation stories and two accounts of the flood) in the text.
- Don't be afraid to ask the really hard questions: Like, did a man really get stuck in the belly of a fish for three days/nights? Or did God really create the world in 6 days? Keep in the mind—the ancient peoples were not as sophisticated as we are, in the areas of astronomy, geography, and/or technology. As you begin your journey of reading the Bible, let me encourage you to be free. Be free to explore, think, pray, laugh, cry, doubt, believe, and to question, wonder and wander (through the text). Because reading the Bible will lead you to do all these things.

Keep in mind, that reading the books of the Bible is not a small undertaking. You may want to carve out a reading plan. It will take you some time to get through it. But also remember that the journey of a thousand miles begins with one step.

Let the journey begin!







If you know of anyone residing in the Spencerport School District, in need of food, they can call 397-0290.




